Subject: Administrative Modification No. 14 to the 2025 Regional Transportation

Improvement Program for the San Diego Association of Governments

The San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG), using the authority delegated to it by Caltrans, approves Administrative Modification No. 14 to the SANDAG 2025 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP). This constitutes an administrative modification to the Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). The changes are consistent with the FTIP/FSTIP Amendment and Administrative Modification Procedures.

Administrative Modification No. 14 makes changes to 6 projects and 2 grouped listings within San Diego County. The projects contained within Administrative Modification No. 14 are fiscally constrained by year based upon available or committed funding and/or reasonable estimates of future funding.

The changes in Administrative Modification No. 14 do not affect air quality conformity and continue to conform to the applicable State Implementation Plan (SIP). The proposed amendment does not reflect any changes in the design, concept, or scope of the project or the conformity analysis years as modeled for the regional emissions analysis of the 2025 RTIP and the Amended 2021 Regional Transportation Plan. The investments described in the 2025 RTIP, as revised with Administrative Modification No. 14, make progress toward achieving the performance targets set by the region in accordance with the applicable provisions and requirements of 23 CFR Part 450.

SANDAG certifies that projects in this amendment are not included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review.
